





An open letter to our fellow Tennesseans:

Our organizations represent nurses, advance practice registered nurses, physician assistants and pharmacists. Our associations and the health care providers we represent work cohesively with others on the health care team to ensure you receive the care you need, no matter the circumstances.

When we chose to become healthcare practitioners, we took an oath that serving patients would be our highest priority. But now we find ourselves putting our lives, and potentially the lives of our loved ones, at risk to protect and care for others during the COVID-19 pandemic. We accept that risk to protect you and to preserve life at all costs, but we cannot do it alone.

We need your help. Just as we partner together to provide care to you in good times and bad, we need Tennesseans to partner with us to defend each other against COVID-19 and prevent the spread across our neighborhoods, communities, and state.
